HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

All entries must be accompanied by: (1) A copy of the Exhibitors National Poultry Improvement Plan (NPIP) official flock certificate, or (2) NPIP 9-2 Test Report, or (3) NPIP approved state plan certificate. Out of State Entry's must fill out the NP-3 form which is free. This rule is true for ALL Shows.

ALL POULTRY, WATERFOWL, AND TURKEYS going to public exhibition must:

<u>NOTICE- For 2024</u> - ALL BIRDS. Texas Poultry Testing Texas P/T Test is accepted. Please send a copy of your papers with your entries. Also, bring a copy of your testing just in case. We MUST have a copy of your test reports with your entries.

IN-STATE

(1) Be from a flock tested for Pullorum-typhoid as part of the National Poultry Improvement Plan (NPIP) and be clean. All Turkeys being exhibited, exported, or participating under the National Poultry Improvement Plan are to be tested **OR** (2) Have been tested within 90 days by an accredited veterinarian or an authorized testing agent.

OUT-OF-STATE

- 1. Any Poultry, Waterfowl, Turkeys, or other exhibition fowl being imported into Oklahoma shall be free of visible evidence of disease.
- **AND** Have passed a negative test for reportable salmonella groups within 90 days prior to entry, with the results recorded on an official form from the state of origin certifying that the testing was done by an authorized agent of the state, **OR**
- Have originated from flocks authoritatively participating in such disease control and eradication phases of the National Poultry Improvement Plan or NPIP approved state plan which shall be negative and clean, **AND** -
- Be from flocks not known to be infected with reportable salmonella groups. Out of State Entry's must fill out the NP-3 form which is free but MUST be filled out to bring your birds into any state. This is true for ALL Shows.
- Poultry qualifying under No. 2 or No. 3 may be reported without an official Health Certificate. –
- All exhibition poultry must be identified by a tamper-proof leg or wing band unless they originate from a flock authoritatively participating in the NPIP or NPIP approved state plan.

Additional info pertaining to the Avian Influenza outbreaks:

- 1. At this time health certificates are not required for entry at our show. AI testing is not required in the state of Oklahoma, as of the printing of this show catalog.
- 2. If a flock is coming from within a quarantined area (the 10 km circle (6.2 miles)), they must obtain a permit from the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture (405-522-6139). A copy of the permit must accompany the entry. Out of State Entries must have the NP-3 form which is free.
- 3. Health requirements for entry are subject to change without notice. Texas PT Testing is accepted.

PLEASE NOTE THE FOLLOWING

We ask that you do not start cooping out until all awards are handed out unless announced otherwise. The Serama Tabletop Show is a separate show than the MEGA SHOW and has different coop-out times & rules. Seramas which are double entered (in-cage & tabletop) will abide by MegaShow rules for coop out. Please show respect to those exhibitors receiving awards. This should also help minimize the loss of any birds due to theft. If there should be an incidence of theft, the show management will commence lock-down and inspection measures to locate said bird. Please know that we value all our exhibitors and want everyone to have an enjoyable experience at this show. We feel that this rule is in the best interest of our exhibitors. For inclement weather with long travel distances, special arrangements can be made. Thank you for your cooperation.

We will have NPIP Certified Testers at the show who can test your birds BEFORE they are cooped in. The charge is <u>\$1.50 per bird</u>, <u>cash only</u>. No Cooping In Until Testing Is Complete!

<u>Youth Showmanship</u> begins after all junior entries are judged. Announcements will be made on the show day. See Junior section of this catalog.

<u>Raffle</u> tickets may be purchased from the raffle table beginning at 9:00 A.M. The Raffle Drawing will take place at the show on Saturday. **Donations for the raffle would be greatly appreciated**.

Judging will continue until all champions are picked.

Awards will be handed out immediately after judging is complete. All Breed Special Premiums will be presented AFTER the regular awards of during the day. **NO Premium Checks Will Be Mailed.** All unclaimed premiums will be donated back to the MEGA SHOW.

Photos will be taken thru the day and completed after the awards ceremony. All photos we take are the property of the CVPC.

The showroom will close approximately 2 hours after completion of judging and the awards are distributed. Birds may be picked up Sunday morning if arraignments are made earlier. Please let show staff know if this is your intention.

Sunday, Nov.3rd, 2024

The showroom will open at 8:00 AM until 10:00 am Only to release birds to those who choose to leave birds overnight.

All pictures taken by our staff belong to the CVPC and the CVPC retains all rights and privileges to use those pictures and they may be used for future promotions of the CVPV, ALFA and the CVJPC.

OPEN & JUNIOR DIVISION **RULES**

All entries and every exhibitor are subject to the following rules:

- 1. The Canadian Valley Poultry Show is open to poultry exhibitors of the world. **No Membership is** required
- 2. The CVPC Poultry Show will provide classes for all APA and ABA recognized Standard Breeds and Varieties of Poultry including Large and Bantam Chickens, Turkeys and Waterfowl.
- 3. Entries must be <u>postmarked no later than October 15th</u>, 2024. LATE ENTRIES <u>MAY NOT</u> BE ACCEPTED. No day of entries or additions will be allowed.
- 4. Birds will be shown as individuals.
- 5. Cocks are male birds one year old or more. Hens are female birds one year old or more. Cockerels are male birds less than one year old. Pullets are female birds less than one year old.
- 6. The second APA definition of a display shall be used at this event for reporting purposes, since Trios are not a part of our show: "A Display shall consist of seven (7) entries, one entry each in cock, hen, cockerel, and pullet, plus three additional entries of the same breed and variety of any sex or age." To help the show secretary, please mark on your entries if you wish.
- 7. We do not fill out breed club reports, but will supply exhibitor lists and other information after the show. Please contact Kirsten Tautfest at ktautfest@gmail.com for data *after* the show.
- 8. ENTRY FORM MUST BE FILLED OUT COMPLETELY, specifying bantam or large fowl, variety, breed, and where applicable single or rose comb, and bearded or non-bearded.
 - a LF: Large Fowl
 - i American, Game, English, Continental, Mediterranean, Asiatic, AOSB
 - b W: Waterfowl
 - c B: Bantam
 - AOCCL, (OE, Amer) Game, Modern Game, Feathered Leg (FL), RCCL, SCCL
 - d T: Turkey
 - e G: Guinea
 - f Mark any double-coop birds in the space provided. Any birds not specified as bantam or large fowl will be entered as large fowl. Long tailed bantams will only be cooped in large fowl cages if cage space is available.
 - g Entry DEADLINE: October. 15th!
 - h Color varieties not recognized may receive a designation of NSV (non-standard variety) at the discretion of the show secretary.
- 9. ENTRY MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY A CHECK OR MONEY ORDER MADE PAYABLE TO THE CANADIAN VALLEY POULTRY CLUB FOR THE CORRECT AMOUNT or paid by PayPal at the time of entry online.
- 10. Mail entries and dues to: CVPC, 10751 Lake Rd, Lexington, OK. 73051 (Entry Deadline is 10-15-24, No Changes after 10-17-24)
- 11. All birds must meet the State Pullorum testing regulations. See regulations inside front cover.
 - a You must attach a copy of your test report with your entry form or bring a copy for us to keep at the show BEFORE you coop-in.
 - b All birds will be inspected for disease upon arrival at the showroom and sick birds will be removed from the showroom.
- Band numbers will not be required on the entry forms. However, we suggest that all fowl be leg banded before being placed in a show coop and that you add the band number to the back of the coop card.
- 12. No shipments will be accepted.
- 13. All sale birds brought to the show shall meet the same health requirements as those exhibited.

 Larry Dye is the Sales Area Chairman. All sales birds MUST be checked in, tested and coop space paid.

Spaces go from Bantam Coop, Large Fowl Coop, 10' x 10' and more. See Entry Form for more details on Pricing. NO SALES BIRDS ACCEPTED UNLESS THE OWNER IS AN ACTUAL EXHIBITOR IN THIS SHOW. Decision of Chairman Larry Dve is final.

- ANYONE who tampers with ANY Coop Tag MAY be disqualified, MAY lose all awards & premiums and MAY be Banned from any future shows. NO ONE is to change anything on ANY Coop Tag. The Show Secretary is the ONLY person allowed to change anything on ANY coop tag.
 - a You are allowed to write a band number on the BACK of the card, not the front.
 - b ALFA stamp shall be on the front, but not to obscure any other data for the judge & clerking staff. Only paid ALFA club members may use the stamp on Large Chickens only.
 - c If you entered a bird, but did not bring it, you may write OUT on the front of the card. This helps with errors and with the judging process.
 - d DO NOT REMOVE coop tags until the awards are announced. Auditing of placing may be required to ensure accuracy of reporting for the APA/ABA.
 - e Open Class: No day of show changes shall be allowed except for clerical error. Please make sure you bring what you entered. Please bring a copy of your entry form.
 - f Junior Class: Changes shall be allowed on a case-by-case basis.
 - Parents/Guardians/Youth Leaders: Please ensure that your child's form is filled out correctly for entries. If you have questions about what a bird might be for color or breed, please contact any of our show staff before sending your entry in.
- 15. Breeds not recognized yet may be placed in the commercial/Backyard Bird class. Exceptions are the breeds and their respective clubs who are actively working on formal recognition. They will be cooped in with their respective classes.
- 16. Cages for the sales area(s) will be provided. All birds for sale MUST be in our Sales Area and must be tested or come from tested flocks.
 - lease limit the number of birds in sales cages so there is no overcrowding.
- 17. Any person found guilty of handling exhibits other than their own, or gathering eggs other than their own will be disqualified as an exhibitor and any premium won shall be forfeited. Show Management is excluded.
- All awards shall be presented on Saturday evening. No awards will be mailed. All checks shall be cashed within 60 days!
- 19. The management reserves the right to remove from the showroom any materials that are deemed objectionable by the CVPC. For the peace of all involved, please leave your political signs at home.
- 20. All exhibitors are responsible for feeding and watering their own birds.
- 21. APA & ABA rules will govern this show unless otherwise stated.
- No protest will be accepted unless made in writing and accompanied by a cash protest fee of \$25.00. A Protest of a judge's decision shall not be considered unless a disqualified bird has been placed.
- 23. The Canadian Valley Poultry Club shall not be responsible for any loss or accident incurred during the show.
- Any case or situation not provided for in these rules will be referred to and decided on by the CVPC leadership.
- Breed Nationals will each receive 1 table and 2 chairs (minimum of 75 birds entered in the breed across all varieties and types both junior and open). If the minimum is not met, the breed club may rent a table and or space for table. The vendor cost will be \$60 for CVPC provided tables, \$50 with your own table (see entry form). Tables or space for your own tables must be purchased in advance by same postmark date as entries. All tables must be in the designated area. Tables are subject to available space.
- Birds will not be released until Saturday after the awards. Anyone removing birds from their assigned cages before they are officially released will forfeit any and all awards won and MAY be barred from any future shows. This includes the reporting to the ABA, APA and all breed clubs. Sunday pick-up can be made between 8:00 am until 10:00 am.

- 27. All Announcements at the show will supersede any and all previous announcement(s), written or spoken.
- 28. ENTRY DEADLINE IS 10-15-2024, Post Marked. No Exceptions. No Changes to entry after 10-17-2024. No Refunds.
- 29. <u>Super Grand Champion and Reserve Super Grand Champion will be selected by all Judges by secret ballot or as a committee. Each Judge will be allowed one vote for his/her Top birds.</u>
- No Exhibitor who has been banned from our shows may enter this event. Their birds may not be shown by another person and if anyone does this they will also be banned and will forfeit any & all entry fees and awards. All birds entered SHALL be entered in the actual owner's name, no exceptions. This is required because of State testing Rules. Those who are banned may ask for reinstatement after approval of the Show Secretary. No Exceptions.
- No entry is complete until it is Paid In Full! Bring Receipts, your copy of the entry form(s), and your NPIP program paperwork, plus the VS-9-3 form if you are from out of state.

SPECIAL EVENT – Breeder's Cup Auction

We will also be conducting a Special Breeders Cup Auction during the Show. Special Invited Breeders will be asked to consign quality pairs or trios of <u>High</u>-quality birds to be auctioned off to the highest bidder. ALL birds will be sifted for quality before the Auction begins. Only the best will be sold in this auction. The breeder will receive 65% and 35% will be donated to the CVJPC Junior Show. Larry Dye will be the Chairman of this event and all interested breeders should contact Larry personally at 405-747-0427. We will offer a set of younger birds which will be great for the Spring Shows. Bring your checkbook!

Special "John Boy's Backyard Bird Bonanza Show" OPEN & JUNIOR combined:

In this show you will enter your birds in the Backyard Division (BYB). All birds, Cocks, Hens, Cockerels and Pullets (Large Fowl and Bantams) will compete against each other for the title of "Backyard King/Queen of the Hill". Any backyard bird may enter this event and all birds will be judged entirely on Color, Uniqueness, Natural Beauty, Condition and Rarity. Backyard winners will be awarded to 10th place with both cash and awards. Everyone can enter their own backyard beauty in the show and see how he/she does. This show will be judged by John McDaniel.

Total BYB Jackpot: \$250

Total ALFA show Jackpot: \$500 (for placings 1 through 10)

Maran Breed special: Total awards to be distributed at the discretion of the breed club: \$500

Ayam Cemani (qualifying meet for inclusion in AOSB as a recognized breed). Total awards to be distributed at the discretion of the breed club.

Special award:

Those traveling the furthest with twenty (20) or more birds shall be included a special award consideration as follows:

Furthest distance: \$175.00 Second furthest: \$150.00 Third furthest: \$75.00

Distance will be determined by the shortest driving distance to the show site as calculated by Google Maps. Those entering with a PO Box number will be calculated to the city and state. In the event of a tie, a coin flip will determine the winner.

JUNIOR DIVISION **RULES**

- 1. All rules that apply to the Open Show will apply to the Junior Show unless otherwise stated.
- 2. A junior is a youth who is at least 5 years old and will not reach their 20th birthday by the date of the show. If birth date is not listed on entry, the entry will be put in the open show. Neither 4-H nor FFA membership is required.
- 3. All birds exhibited in the Junior Show must be owned by the junior exhibiting them for a minimum of 90 days. Anyone caught cheating will be banned for life from this show and will forfeit all premiums won at this show.
- 4. Each Junior Exhibitor must enter birds on a separate Junior Division Entry Form. All entry forms MUST be signed by both exhibitor and guardian.
- 5. Junior exhibitors must be present at the show to be eligible to receive awards unless granted an exception by the Show Manager.
- 6. Junior exhibitors are permitted to enter as many birds as they wish in any APA or ABA recognized class. See Backyard Birds section for non-ABA/APA rules. Ayam Cemani shall be entered into the AOSB class.
- 7. Any case or situation not provided for in the above rules will be referred to and decided on by the Executive Board of the CVPC.
- 8. To minimize show day drama, please print and be sure to use correct color names and be clear on bantam vs large fowl. Visit the APA and/or ABA websites for a current list of breeds and varieties. Ayam Cemani shall be entered into the AOSB class but are not yet eligible to win class champion.
- 9. Entry Deadline is 10-15-24. No Exceptions. No changes to entries after 10-17-24. No refunds.
- 10. All Entries <u>MUST</u> have accurate contact information included, i.e. Phone, e-mail, etc. so immediate contact is available. Please PRINT. <u>If contacted, you MUST contact us immediately to avoid disqualification from the show. No entry is complete until it is Paid In Full!</u>
- 11. Entry into this show implies consent to be photographed and/or videoed for publishing on social media for marketing and/or announcement purposes. If you do not wish to have your youth photographed, please alert show staff.
- 12. All announcements made at the show will supersede any and all announcements made prior to the show.

Banners. plaques, or rosettes will be awarded for class champions regardless of class minimums. Lesser amount awards MAY be awarded if the minimum numbers are not met. This shall be a day of show decision. Ribbons through 5th place for Juniors only will be available after the awards are handed out. Junior exhibitors wanting ribbons should bring their coop cards with the places to an announced location.

YOUTH SHOWMANSHIP AWARDS & DIVISIONS

A minimum of 3-4 Classes will be contested. All contestants shall have birds entered in this show and all showmanship birds shall be entered. No Exceptions without prior approval of show management. Awards and/or ribbons will be presented for the top showperons in each class.

A separate sign-up sheet will be available on Saturday morning of the show after 9:00 AM. This will be the list used to determine the class/age cuts for the showmanship classes.

If showmanship begins before all the junior entries are judged, please leave a note on your coop if your bird has not been judged if you remove the bird for the showmanship contest. We want all birds to be judged. A clerk will find you to bring your bird back for assessment.

- 4) Sign Up/ Enter Saturday Morning, Nov. 2nd, the day of the show.
- 5) Decision of the Judge(s) is FINAL.

- 7) Classes for White, Brown, Marans, and all other colors.
- 8) Eggs may be Large Chicken, Bantams, Turkey, Guineas, Ducks, Geese, and Decorated Eggs.
- 9) The judge has full discretion to assign classes for all eggs entered.
- 10) The judge may break eggs for examination.
- 11) No Limit on number of exhibits per exhibitor.
- 12) Entry Fee is \$3.00 PER EXHIBIT ENTERED.

Special Note- All Add-on Money must be claimed by the winning exhibitor immediately after the MEGA SHOW has concluded. No Checks will be mailed out. You MUST have proper ID to claim money and all checks will be made out to the person listed as the exhibitor and given to only the exhibitor in person unless approved by show management ahead of time.

The MEGA SHOW was a concept thought up by us years ago in which we would develop a show which was more than simply a poultry show but rather an event.

The first show that I conducted was in 1972 in Norman, OK. which had 1,200 entries. I was fresh out of high school and had just gotten my APA Judges License and was full blown into poultry, all aspects of poultry from breeding, showing, judging, and promoting. I began my poultry adventure in High School back in 1965-1966. Yes, I started with those famous Murry McMurry Hatchery Chicks that everyone back then started with. But I found that although some of the chicks were not show quality birds that many displayed the defects that the APA Standard pointed out. After ordering nearly 10 sets of these 100 packs of assorted chicks I learned a great deal, about good birds, bad birds, defects and disqualifications. All the old timers probably remember the posters the hatchery gave out which had all the fantastic pictures of all the grand birds we have/had. After being injured at work and out of work for over a year I decided to get my APA Judges License at the ripe old age of 19. But I first became a lifetime member of the APA to assure that I would never lose that honor of being a judge. I attended many shows and had many great mentors along the way—breeders like Hi Patton of KS, Leo Bowers of Stillwater, OK, A.J. Lance of Alex, OK, Ken Poynor of Norman, OK, etc. After studying for well over a year I decided to take my test in Hutchinson, KS at the APA Nationals (I believe) under the legendary Hi Patton. I passed. Did very well in fact. Mr. Patton taught me the most important thing I have ever learned as a judge: never go to a show to judge without your Standard in hand. When I questioned him on this he plainly stated, "Boy, do you ever see a preacher go into church without his Bible?" Point well taken. My judges Number is 1009. There are only a handful of judges still around with a lower license number than I have. I do not know whether this is good or bad. I was the youngest person to ever get a judge's card at the time. (Smiling now)

After taking off for college and moving to town I gave all my birds to Eugene Murnan as I could not care for them once I started college. So, I lost contact with many people in the poultry world.

Fast forward 30+ years to 2014. I decided to take my son to our local country fair when I ran across longtime friend John McDaniel. John and I used to show against each other in both crops, swine, and cattle. The fair was in bad shape the first time I attended after the break. John asked me if I would help them get their show up to snuff. At first, I said NO but then agreed to "help" them. Poultry is like a virus, once you get the fever you are consumed by it. It wasn't long before I asked if we could start a club, then a show, then a bigger show and finally a MEGA SHOW. You see, I don't believe in doing anything small or doing something just to go along to get along. I strive for the BEST, always have. But the Poultry world had changed from what it used to be back in the 60's and 70's. I suppose the whole world has changed including attitudes, ideas, actions, etc.

Once I started conducting shows I learned that the poultry show world that I once knew no longer existed, at least in the way I remembered it. It seemed to me that things like kids and families being involved, having fun and enjoying the poultry fancy were virtually non-existent. Everything and everyone seemed to be so competitive, and shows were more like professional wrestling matches. It seemed to me people were more involved in showing up, showing, and leaving than they were in having a great time building memories, enjoying themselves and spreading knowledge. I did not like this change. I decided early on that I wanted to build a show where I could personally meet and greet the exhibitors, get to know them and their families and what they do, what they raise and what their likes and dislikes are in the poultry world. To this day I enjoy meeting the exhibitors and providing a show they can enjoy along with their husbands, wives, and family. AKA, an EVENT!

Fast forward a few years to the present. The MEGA SHOW. An Event!

My concept of the MEGA SHOW was one in which I wanted to emphasis the importance of our youth and their education, involvement, and participation in our shows. Yes, the future of the fancy is in the hands of our youth but what many forget is that if our youth are not properly groomed and educated and respectful of those who came before them our fancy will slowly disappear. They must also realize that this fancy is not a sport of physical contact but rather an opportunity to learn the true beauty of the birds, the people and the atmosphere of a family friendly poultry show and environment. Too many people who are involved in poultry and our shows today are in this for themselves and they think of themselves first and foremost. These are traits that are quickly learned by our youth. I teach the kids who come through our Junior Poultry Club what respect is and how to say, "Thank You." When people ask me what is wrong with the youth of today, I simply say, "They are a product of their environment." In other words, we WILL reap what we sow. If we want respect, we must show it to others. Someone is always watching us especially our youth.

The MEGA Show is an opportunity for all exhibitors, adult and junior, to attend a show where they are respected, treated fairly & squarely and where they can enjoy themselves and their families can be treated the same. At the same time, they can show with and against some of the very best SOP Poultry in the country, learn from legendary breeders and exhibitors, learn, have an enjoyable time, make new quality friends, and experience a poultry show that simply is not just another chicken show. This theme may or may not interest some people and that is fine. I love reading about all the great shows of the past including the mind-boggling shows at Madison Square Garden and the other legendary shows of the past.

The past year has been a real challenge to all poultry breeders and exhibitors and our shows were no exception. My fear now is that we'll lose several of our old time shows and the people who have conducted these shows as many promoters are getting up in our years. This is another reason we need to train and teach our younger people the basics of conducting shows and thinking about the fancy. We lost nearly 20% of our entries in recent shows because of Covid 19. It was just by the grace of God that we were able to conduct all our shows but through the use of education, safety and prevention we were successful in conducting our shows including a modern-day record for our MiniMega in Hutchinson, KS. and approximately 3,000 entries in the Mega Show in November, 2020.

We believe the MEGA SHOW offers the best combination of Premiums, Awards, Judges, Events, Atmosphere, Fellowship and Fun Times. The MEGA Show is a combination of the past and the future of the fancy. Many people love this concept and others will slowly follow while kicking and screaming. But the MEGA SHOW will always be a refuge for those who want more than just a simple "poultry show."
